# 2026 Voter Guide

### **Election Calendar:**

- Annual Town Election – Saturday, May 16<sup>th</sup>
- State Primary – Tuesday, September 1<sup>st</sup>
- State Election – Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>

### **How do I Register to Vote?**

1. First, head to [www.voteinma.com](http://www.voteinma.com) and select “check my voter information” to view your current voter status.
2. If your voter registration is incorrect (ex. wrong address) OR you are not registered to vote, you must submit a voter registration application. This can be done in our office at 26 Court St, by mail or online at the same website under “register to vote” or “update my voter registration”. The deadline to register to vote is 10 days before any election.

### **How do I Vote by Mail?**

**You must apply every year to vote by mail.** This can be done in our office at 26 Court St, by mail or online at [www.voteinma.com](http://www.voteinma.com). Additionally, the state will mail out vote by mail application postcards ahead of state and federal elections every two years.

### **We recommend voting and returning your vote by mail ballot as soon as possible.**

Once you receive your vote by mail ballot, vote and seal your ballot in the brown ballot envelope. Once sealed, complete and sign the ballot envelope as indicated. You may return your ballot by mail, place it in the drop box outside of town hall or bring it directly to the Town Clerk's Office.

### **How do I Know if My Vote by Mail Ballot was Accepted?**

### **Where do I Vote? What Precinct am I?**

You can find your precinct and polling location information at [www.voteinma.com](http://www.voteinma.com). Just select “find my polling place” and enter your information.

## How and Where do I Vote Early?

Any registered voter can vote early, you do not need to apply. Early voting is held at Town Hall typically the week and weekend before an election during Town Hall operating hours. Please visit [www.plymouth-ma.gov/elections](http://www.plymouth-ma.gov/elections) to see early voting hours for an upcoming election.

## What is My “Party Enrollment”?

Party enrollment is the political party you choose to identify with when you register to vote. There are two political parties with their own ballots and ballot lines in Massachusetts: Democratic and Republican. **If you are enrolled in a political party, you can only vote on that party’s ballot during a state or federal primary.**

Voters may also choose “unenrolled” or “no party,” commonly known as “independent,” when registering to vote. **Unenrolled voters must choose a party** when voting in state and federal primary elections – including when applying to vote by mail. This does not enroll them in that party.

Additionally, there are a variety of legal political designations in Massachusetts that do not have their own ballots or ballot lines. Voters enrolled in a designation, similar to unenrolled voters, must choose a party ballot when voting in primaries. The designations are: America First Party, American Independent Party, American Term Limits, Conservative Party, Constitution Party, Green Party USA, Green-Rainbow, Interdependent 3rd Party, Latino-Vote Party, Libertarian, Massachusetts Independent Party, Natural Law Party, New Alliance Party, New World Council, Pirate, Pizza Party, Prohibition Party, Rainbow Coalition, Reform Party, Socialist, The People's Party, Twelve Visions Party, Timesizing Not Downsizing, United Independent Party, Unity Party, Veterans Party America, We The People, Workers Party, Working Families, World Citizens Party, and Forward Party
